Director's Take

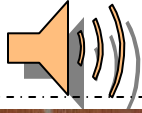

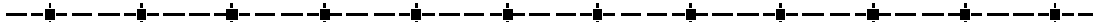
Car Wash Update

What is Shared Cost?

Why do we need to pay it?

Each student that is a member of the Royal Wilson Marching Alliance has a financial obligation for the year; known as "shared cost". These funds are necessary to pay for specialized instructors, vehicles to move equipment to each field show, competition and football game, entry fees for the competitions, new instruments and equipment for the *RWMA*, uniforms, repair and maintenance of existing instruments and equipment, and food for the students on the competition days, usually Saturday. The funds provided by the school district do not come close to covering all these expenses, especially for a group of 120 students. This year, we estimate that in addition to the shared costs we will collect, the WIM Club will have to raise approximately \$40,000 through fundraisers to meet all these expenses.

The shared cost obligation for the band members and the color guard are different. For each band member, the shared cost obligation of **\$325** is due Wednesday, August 13th, the first day of band camp. It can be paid as a lump sum or in three installments. If you choose to pay by installments, they are due on the following dates:

First Installment: Due: August 13th \$100

Second Installment: Due: October 1st \$100

Third Installment: Due: November 3rd \$125

The first installment is due the first day of band camp. Fundraising events are scheduled each month, beginning in band camp, to help the students earn their shared cost obligation. The WIM Club also has a scrip program. You can purchase scrip for many stores, restaurants, and other services in the area. A percentage of the face value of the scrip will go to your student's shared cost account. Purchasing scrip is a very easy and quick way to raise some of your shared cost obligation.

The Golden State Field Classic (GSFC) is the WIM Club's major fund raising event of the year. This single event brings in the most funds to offset the \$40,000 we need to raise. Everyone in the *RWMA* is responsible for selling advertisements for the GSFC Program. Your student received information on selling these ads during the second week of summer band. The selling of ads is underway and many students have already turned in some ads.

Finally, Mr. Chang is the administrator for all of the students' shared cost accounts. Any questions you may have about the balance in your account should be directed to him. If you have any financial constraints or questions, please bring the matter to Mr. Chang's attention immediately and he will work with you.

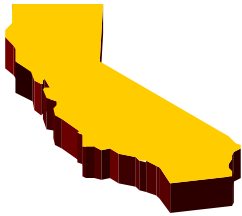

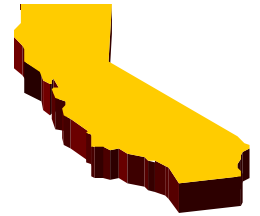

GOLDEN STATE FIELD CLASSIC – “GSFC”
FIELD SHOW COMPETITION
It is that time of year – AGAIN!!!!



The most important fundraising event of the year for the WIM Club is the **“Golden State Field Classic (GSFC)”**. This year marks the twentieth year of this event and it will be held on Saturday, October 25th, at Glen A. Wilson Wildcat Stadium. The entire Royal Wilson Marching Alliance hosts this event. All students of the *RWMA* are expected to work the entire day and sell advertising space in the souvenir program. Parents are asked to work at least one, four hour shift and are encouraged to contact their employer and friends to solicit ads. The marching band and color guard depend on this fundraiser to make up the funding gap between the shared cost requirements and expected expenditures for the year. Everyone supports this event including the Wilson High School administrators, the Hacienda-La Puente District management and the HLPUSD Board of Education.

The GSFC is an adjudicated event; meaning official judges from the Southern California School Band & Orchestra Association are selected to evaluate each band’s performance of their field show. For the past nineteen years, we have hosted a very successful tournament, thanks to the generous support of parents, students, alumni, friends, and community businesses. It is estimated that approximately 8,000 – 10,000 people attend our day long event. **Everyone must help by volunteering to work that day!**

The GSFC is organized on a committee system. Committee Chairpersons are volunteer parents from the band and color guard. Each committee chairperson needs volunteers to work shifts during the day.

This is a critical year for us. Many of the chairpersons from the last couple of years have “graduated”, and we need new parents to step forward and take these positions. The one good thing is that the past parents have left excellent written instructions on what needs to be done. The biggest responsibility is overseeing the volunteers and students working in that area on the day of the GSFC.

The following are the committees we need new chairpersons for. If you have an interest or talent in one of these areas please let me know.

- Concessions***
- Facilities Management***
- Locker Room Management***
- GSFC Program - Layout***
