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Director's Take

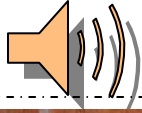

This year, the Southern California School and Orchestra Association, the association that we use adjudicators from, put a limit to the number of groups that a tournament can have. The intention was to make sure the judges were not burned out by the end of the day at tournaments with a lot of groups. We have benefited from this new guideline because directors are now applying to tournaments early to ensure their participation and in turn, tournament directors are able to set their schedules early if they fill up their tournaments, making planning easier. Knowing that our turnout will be great even if we don't add another group (we currently have 31 groups performing), we know we will need a lot of help on October 25. So, please keep your calendars clear and plan on joining us to help make our tournament another great success.

Band Tournament Scoring

Ever wonder how groups are scored at competitions? Below are descriptions of the three captions that make up the total "Band" score. This might help you better understand how bands are scored and solve the mystery of why the group you thought should have won didn't.

MUSIC PERFORMANCE

The Music Performance caption carries the highest assignment of points (450 out of 1000). To be judged objectively, the musical performance must be evaluated only with regard to factors perceived aurally. Adjudicators are not to consider extraneous information. It is important to understand that adjudicators evaluate what is being performed at the same time they are evaluating how it is being performed. Since adjudicators assess achievement, it is understood that the construction and content of a program, in combination with the performance level that is being demonstrated, will determine the achievement level.

GENERAL EFFECT

The General Effect caption carries the next highest number of points (350 out of 1000). The General Effect judge appraises the total product of performance, including all aspects of program design, execution, and coordination. The ensemble is to cause reaction to the expression of emotional, intellectual and aesthetic efforts. Therefore, evaluation is based on an impression type analysis. Adjudicators are not to consider extraneous information. It is important to understand that adjudicators evaluate what is being performed at the same time they are evaluating how it is being performed. Since adjudicators assess achievement, it is understood that the construction and content of a program, in combination with the performance level that is being demonstrated, will determine the achievement level.

VISUAL PERFORMANCE

The Visual Performance caption carries the remaining points (200 out of 1000). The Visual Performance judge assesses the depth and quality of visual performance technique and the expression of execution excellence, while considering the composition of all elements of the visual program. To be judged objectively, the visual performance must be evaluated only with regard to factors perceived visually. Adjudicators are not to consider extraneous information. It is important to understand that adjudicators evaluate what is being performed at the same time they are evaluating how it is being performed. Since adjudicators assess achievement, it is understood that the construction and content of a program, in combination with the performance level that is being demonstrated, will determine the achievement level.

The total Band score (which may be mislabeled since it assesses all units of the including the auxiliary units and not just the band) takes the total of the above captions and multiplies it by 0.1. Penalties may be deducted from this sub-total and the final Band score is reached.
