## **1985 PRESIDENTIAL INAUGURATION**

As our new President has now been sworn in, this is a good time to reflect on the history of the Wilson Band and Ronald Reagan's 1985 Presidential Inauguration. As some of you may know, the Wilson Band was involved in the Ronald Reagan's 1985 Presidential Inauguration. And if you've noticed the flag in the Band Room, you know that the flag is also connected to the inauguration. However, most of you may not know the entire story...

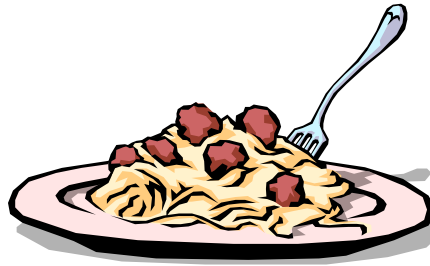
The Wilson Band, under the direction of Gil Adams, was invited to represent Los Angeles County in Sacramento for the rededication of the Capitol Building in 1982. The state senator at the time was William Campbell who lived in Hacienda Heights. He later nominated the Wilson Band to represent California in Ronald Reagan's second inauguration. The Band applied and was accepted. To raise funds for the trip to Washington D.C., the Band sold anything and everything that was profitable. Local Congressman David Dreier helped support the fund raising drive. He made an appeal to help raise funds on a local radio station, but the broadcast was heard nationwide. The Band received donations from states as far away as Florida and Washington. Enough funds were raised to purchase plane tickets and stay at the J.C. Penney College in the District of Columbia. When the Wilson Band arrived in Washington, Congressman Dreier arranged for the Band to visit him and go through his offices.

At the time of the Inauguration, there was a huge snowstorm that caused telephone lines to go down. Communication was limited to cell phones and telegraph messages. The tour guide for the Band sent a telegram to Mr. Adams requesting his attendance at a meeting for the parade participants at a local Army post. An old salt explained that the parade was cancelled due to the weather and ceremonies were moved inside the Capital Centre, an indoor arena in nearby Landover, Maryland. It was so cold that when the band took a two-hour tour of the National Cathedral on the way to the Cap, all the instruments and beverages in the bus undercarriage were froze.

Because President Reagan was from California, the Wilson Band was selected to play for the President. At the ceremony, the Band was seated right next to Vice President George Bush and his wife as well as President Reagan and his wife. It was a great treat. The Band played for the President along with another band representing Texas where Vice President Bush was from. The band from Texas was disappointed because the Wilson Band got to play first. When the eight band directors met Gil, they asked him where the other directors were seated and they laughed when he explained that he was the only director (evidently, the Texas directors left some other directors at home).

The rest of the trip was very memorable. The Band got to tour many historical sites including the FBI building, the Washington Monument, Lincoln Memorial, Jefferson's Memorial, Mount Vernon, the Smithsonian, Library of Congress, the White House, and the Capitol Building. To commemorate this historic event, the flag that was actually flown over the Capitol Building during the hours that the parade would have been taken place was presented to the Wilson Band. This flag is now displayed in the Band Room.
